

What you need to know about **DACA**

As a result of the measures announced by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) on September 5th, 2017, it is important to know:



 Your DACA and work permit will remain valid until their expiration dates.



 DACA renewal applications and work permits that expire on or before March 5th, 2018 will be accepted. The renewal application must be filed by October 5th, 2017.





- DHS will not accept new DACA applications.
- However, initial applications and work permits that were filed before September 5th, 2017 will be processed.





 DHS will not process any new or pending applications for traveling abroad with Advance Parole.











Do you have **DACA** and plan to travel outside of the US?

As a result of the measures announce by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) on September 5th, 2017, it is important to know:



 New applications for Advance Parole related to DACA will not be approved.

 Advance Parole applications that were pending will not be approved. The fees will be refunded.


- If you have an approved Advance Parole, its validity will be respected. However, admission upon your return will be subject to the decision of the immigration officer (CBP).
- Remember that USCIS has the authority to revoke existing Advance Parole.
