

## AEROMEXICO ADJUSTS ITS OPERATIONS DUE THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK

**Mexico City, April 26, 2020.-** For Aeromexico, the safety of its clients and employees is a top priority, so we will continue to implement preventive measures and adjust our operations.

It is important to note that the situation is evolving rapidly, meaning our network adjustments are continually changing. We will continue to reflect these changes in Aeromexico official channels.

The adjustments due to the closing of borders and the reduction in demand are as follows:

ASIA	
Seoul (ICN)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 2 with 2 frequencies per week.
Tokyo (NRT)	Reduced to 2 frequencies per week through May 31.

CANADA	
Vancouver (YVR)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 1 with 1 frequency per week. Increases to 2 frequencies per week from May 7 to May 31.
Montreal (YUL) and Toronto (YYZ)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.

CARIBBEAN	
Havana (HAV), Santo Domingo (SDQ)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.

CENTRAL AMERICA		
Guatemala (GUA)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 1 with 1 frequency per week.	
San Jose (SJO)	Suspended until May 15. Operations will resume on May 16 with 2 frequencies per week.	
Managua (MGA), San Pedro Sula (SAP), and San Salvador (SAL)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.	



Panama (PTY)	Cancelled. No resumption.

EUROPE	
Amsterdam (AMS), Paris (CDG)	Reduced to 1 frequency per week through May 13. Increases to 2 frequencies per week from May 14 through May 31.
Barcelona (BCN)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.
London (LHR)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.
Madrid (MAD)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 1 with 1 frequency per week. Increases to 2 frequencies per week from May 14 through May 31.

SOUTH AMERICA	
Lima (LIM)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 1 with 2 frequencies per week. Increases to 5 frequencies per week from May 15 to May 31.
Sao Paulo (GRU)	Suspended until April 30. Operations will resume on May 1 with 1 frequency per week.
Bogota (BOG), Buenos Aires (EZE), Medellin (MDE), Quito (UIO) and Santiago de Chile (SCL)	Suspended until May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.

New York (JFK)	Suspended April 27 through May 15. Operations will resume on May 16 with 3 frequencies per week.	
Los Angeles (LAX)	Reduced to 3 frequencies per week until May 31.	
Chicago (ORD)	Suspended April 27 through May 31. Operations will resume on June 1.
