

PRESIDENTIAL DECISIONS AFTER 100 DAYS IN OFFICE

On December 1, at the National Palace, President Enrique Peña Nieto announced the **13 presidential decisions**, which, after his first hundred days in office, reflect the government's commitment to achieving the transformation of Mexico.

1. In relation to the **National Program for the Prevention of Violence and Crime**, Enrique Peña Nieto President instructed nine Secretariats of State policies to design clear objectives and avoid the duplication of functions in achieving this goal.
2. On January 9, the **General Law of Victims** was published in the **Official Gazette**.
3. In order to eliminate impunity, the Attorney General's Office is already working on the design of a **Single Code of Criminal Procedures and General Penal Law**.
4. The **National Campaign against Hunger** was launched, to deal with 7.4 million Mexicans who suffer the double condition of extreme poverty and severe food shortages. An **Interministerial Commission** was established for its implementation.
5. In the Federal Expenditure Budget 2013, 400 million pesos were allocated to the creation of **Life Insurance for female Heads of Household**.
6. The **Pension Program for Senior Citizens**, with national coverage and an investment of 26 billion pesos was presented. The decree for the enactment of the Constitutional Reform in regard to education was signed.
7. The Secretariat of Communications and Transport has speeded up the work of the **National Plan for Infrastructure and Transport 2013-2018**.
8. The **Transpeninsular Train**, which will run from the city of Mérida to Punta Venado, Riviera Maya, near Playa del Carmen has been implemented. It will have a length of 336 kilometers.
9. The Secretariat of Communications and Transport and the Government of Nuevo León signed a collaboration agreement for the construction of **Line 3 of the Monterrey Metro**, in addition to which the Santa Barbara – Izúcar of Matamoros Highway has been resurfaced, and the second stage of the Naucalpan – Ecatepec Highway inaugurated.
10. **The Economic Package 2013** was approved with a zero budgetary deficit. The package allocates more resources to investment spending on works, programs and activities of direct benefit to the population.
11. Moreover, work is underway on the **National Fiscal Responsibility and Public Debt Act**.
12. The authorities have worked on the agreements and consensuses needed to integrate and promote structural reforms in telecommunications.

Achieving an inclusive, prosperous Mexico at peace, with quality education for all, with global responsibility is a task for everyone. Together we will be able to transform and move Mexico.
