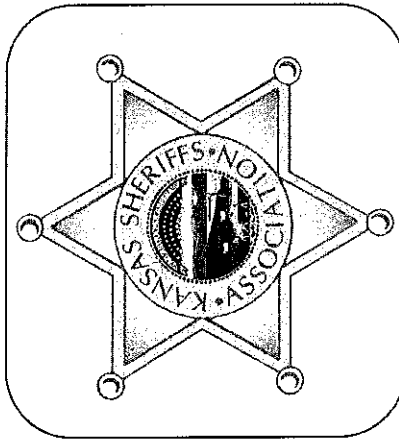

About the Seminar

Case Study, Topeka Officers Shooting: A review of the 12-16-2012 murders of two officers, the aftermath, and the lessons learned on the importance of preplanning such events, care and attention to other employees, and psychological aftercare.

Mental Health for Ourselves and Officers: Topics include behavioral/emotional signs of officer distress, research on stress, resilience, and suicide, PTSD issues in officers and returning soldiers, Emotional survival, Handling group and individual CSTD, Officer trauma, Peer support teams, Fitness for duty evaluations/referrals.

Living Wills and Power of Attorney: The KSA/KS Bar Assn. program is explained.

Juvenile Justice Authority Briefing: Topics will include sharing the basic tenets of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, Updates and new findings, and Problem solving issues related to handling juveniles.

KBI Transitions: The transitions that the KBI will be making in the near future because of Financial Constraints and Staffing Levels.

Record Retention Paper / Electronic: Topics include the importance of good records management, Records management laws and structures in Kansas, Records retention and disposition schedules and their revisions, Electronic records retention and a Q & A session.

Consulate Notification and Related Matters of Access: Legal issues dealing with Consulate Notification and Related Matters of Access.

Heart of America Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory: An overview of the Heart of America Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory (HARCFLL), and what they can provide to Kansas law enforcement.

SAFE Program: SEATBELTS ARE FOR EVERYONE (SAFE) is a cooperative effort between students, law enforcement and advocates to increase restraint compliance through positive rewards, education and enforcement.

Strip Searches: Topics include the current laws, policies and issues related to strip searches.

Bullying in the Workplace / Suicide and the Mentally Ill in Jail: Topics include liability and policy issues surrounding two of the timeliest legal problems that a Sheriff can face.

About the Instructors

Chief Ron Miller, Topeka Police Dept.

Ronald Miller, was appointed Chief of Police in Topeka in 2006. He is in his 41st year of Kansas law enforcement and was previously the Chief of Police in Kansas City Kansas for 6 years rising through the ranks from Patrol Officer where he started in 1972. Chief Miller holds a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Central Missouri and a Master's Degree from Wichita State University. He is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar, the Southern Police Institute, and the Senior Management Institute for Policing at Harvard/Boston University. Chief Miller is a member of the Police Executive Research Forum.

Dr. Daniel C. Claiborn, Forensic Psychology Associates, Overland Park, KS

Dr. Claiborn has served as a police and forensic psychologist for over 32 years. He trained with the FBI at Quantico, with the NYPD in hostage negotiations, and with the Laboratory for Scientific Interrogation in Phoenix. He has taught at police academies for over 20 years, and is a member of the Society for Police and Criminal Psychology and the Psychology Section of the IACP. He is currently the Ethics Chair for the Kansas Psychological Association, and he has three times been President of the Kansas Association of Professional Psychologists and the Practice Division of the Kansas Psychological Association.

Archivist Marcella Wiget, Kansas Historical Society

Ms. Wiget has been an archivist with the Kansas Historical Society (KHS) since 2008, arranging and describing government records and manuscript collections from private donors and organizations. She also runs the records management program for KHS and the State Archives, providing training and helping executive-branch state agencies and counties revise and update their retention schedules. Prior to the KHS she was assistant archivist with the Bessemer Historical Society in Pueblo, Colorado, and was Curator of Collections for the Reno County Historical Society in Hutchinson, Kansas.
