

Permanent Residence Visa

General Requirements:

1. To schedule an appointment please send an email to: visaslasvegas@sre.gob.mx
2. Print and fill out the visa application form:

3. One passport-size photograph: white background, clear view of the face (glasses or other accessories are NOT ALLOWED, filters or image alterations are NOT ALLOWED.)
4. Comply with original or certified documents required according to the category.
5. Visa fee: \$51 USD

The appointment does NOT guarantee the issuance of the visa; it is the applicant's responsibility to provide the required documents on the day of their interview. Applicants must present original documents and if required, the proper certifications and/or apostilles.

The processing time of a visa may take 1-10 business days from the day of the appointment.

<p>Retirees and Pensioners</p>	<p><u>This category is meant exclusively for retirees and/or pensioners and must provide a letter or official document that proves the retirement.</u></p> <p>-Economic Solvency (choose one of the 2 options):</p> <p>A. Proof of investments or bank statements for the <u>last 12 months</u> with a minimum balance of at least \$207,440 USD per person.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Or</p> <p>B. Proof of pension: Bank statements for the <u>last 6 months</u> with a monthly income of at least \$ 5,186 USD per person.</p>
<p>Family unit with a Permanent Resident</p>	<p><u>Choose one option:</u></p> <p>A. If the applicant has a child that is a Permanent Resident: The child's birth certificate and the permanent resident card or visa.</p> <p>B. If the applicant is the child of a Permanent Resident: The birth certificate of the applicant; permanent resident card/visa from the father or mother; birth certificate from the mother or father.</p> <p>C. If the applicant is the child of the spouse, common-law partner, or equivalent (proving that applicant is under 18 and NOT married): Applicant's birth certificate; marriage or common-law certificate, and permanent resident card/visa holder.</p> <p>D. If the applicant is the sibling of a Permanent Resident: Birth certificates of both applicant and Permanent Resident, as well as the Permanent Resident card/visa holder.</p>
<p>Family unit with a Mexican Citizen</p>	<p><u>Choose one option:</u></p> <p>A. If the applicant has a child who is a Mexican Citizen: Provide the child's Mexican birth certificate.</p> <p>B. If the applicant is the child of a Mexican Citizen (only applicable for minors under 18 who are NOT eligible for Mexican Nationality and who have NOT contracted marriage, or if they are in a state of interdiction or are under legal representation.): Provide applicant's birth certificate and an official document proving the parent's Mexican nationality.</p> <p>C. If the applicant is the child of the spouse, common-law partner, or similar of a Mexican citizen (only applicable for minors under 18 who are NOT eligible for Mexican nationality and who have NOT contracted marriage, or if they are in a state of interdiction or are under legal representation.): Provide a birth certificate, marriage or common-law certificate, and a document proving Mexican nationality.</p> <p>D. If the applicant is the sibling (under 18) of a Mexican Citizen: Provide both applicant's and sibling's birth certificates and a document proving Mexican nationality.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>For the family unit categories:</u></p> <p><u>The sponsor must provide proof of economic solvency with investments or bank accounts with a monthly income or balance of \$1,037 USD per person.</u></p> <p><u>Only applicable to cases of Family Unity with a foreigner holding a Permanent Resident visa.</u></p>
