

Student Temporary Residence Visa

General Requirements:

- 1. To schedule an appointment please send an email to: visaslasvegas@sre.gob.mx
- 2. Print and fill out the visa application form: https://consulmex.sre.gob.mx/lasvegas/index.php/servicios-extranjeros/visas
- 3. One passport-size photograph: white background, clear view of the face (glasses or other accessories are NOT ALLOWED, filters or image alterations are NOT ALLOWED.)
- 4. Comply with original or certified documents required according to the category.
- 5. Visa fee: \$54 USD

The appointment does NOT guarantee the issuance of the visa; it is the applicant's responsibility to provide the required documents on the day of their interview. Applicants must present original documents and if required, the proper certifications and/or apostilles. The processing time of a visa may take 1-10 business days from the day of the appointment.

Letter of Acceptance	Letter of acceptance and economic solvency
	The letter of acceptance from the institution where the applicant intends to study must include: 1. Student's full name 2. Level, grade, and area of study that the applicant intends to perform 3. Name of the course 4. Course cycle (start and end dates) 5. Cost of tuition for the course (school fees) 6. School contact information.
Economic	Economic Solvency
Solvency	Provide the necessary documentation to prove the cost of tuition, living, board, and lodging during their stay in México; this can be proved through one of the following: Choose one option:
	Original documents proving the applicant has an employment, pension, or, scholarship with a monthly income of at least \$1,360 USD, during the last 3 months. Or
	Original proof of investment or current bank statement with a monthly average balance of \$13,613 USD, the latest 3 months.
	Solvency may be accredited by the applicant, by his parents or by the person exercising parental authority or guardianship, proving they are not older than 25 years, or with a letter from the educational institution that proves that he/she has been a beneficiary of a scholarship or document from a banking or financial institution that certifies that it has the financing.
