



## PERMANENT RESIDENT VISA

### REQUIREMENTS:

1. Make an appointment <https://mexitel.sre.gob.mx/citas.webportal/pages/public/login/login.jsf>
2. Visa application form
3. Valid passport
4. One photo passport size (without glasses)
5. Fee \$40.00 usd
6. Comply with original or certified documents required according to the category:

### CATEGORIES:

#### a) Retirees and pensioners (choose one option)

- Proof of investment: Bank statements (last 12 months) with monthly balance overall to \$129,000 usd per-person.
- Proof of income from pension: Bank statements (last 6 months) with monthly income of at least \$3,200 usd per-person.

#### b) Family unit/Permanent resident

- Son/daughter: Birth certificate of the child and the permanent resident card or visa holder.
- Parents (minors): Birth certificate of the applicant and permanent resident card/visa from father or mother.
- Child of the spouse or common-law partner or equivalent, must provide that the applicant is a child or an adolescent who is not married: applicant's birth certificate and marriage or common-law certificate and permanent resident card/visa holder.
- Brother/sister: Birth certificate from applicants and permanent resident (both) and permanent resident card/visa holder.
  - Proof of economic solvency to support the family with investments: bank statements showing an average monthly balance more than \$600 usd (12 months) per-person or proof of income with pension: bank statements with monthly income of more \$600 usd (6 months) per-person.

#### c) Family unit with Mexican

- Son/daughter: Birth certificate of the child and document proving Mexican nationality



- Father/Mother (minors): If the applicant has a Mexican father or mother, as long as she is a child or adolescent and does not have the right to Mexican nationality and has not contracted marriage or is in a state of interdiction and is under their legal representation, the applicant's birth certificate and document proving Mexican nationality from father/mother.
- Child of the spouse or common-law partner or equivalent, must provide that the applicant is a child or an adolescent who is not married: applicant's birth certificate and marriage or common-law certificate and document proving Mexican nationality
- Brother/sister (minors): Birth certificate from applicants and Mexican brother/sister (both) and document proving Mexican nationality.
