The United We Dream Education Not Deportation (END) Program, has been organizing and campaigning to stop people's deportation on a case-by-case basis since 2013. Together with undocumented leadership and volunteer-led teams across the country we have helped stopped the deportation of more than 500 people!

After Obama's immigration action, the END Program recognizes that the most vulnerable people are individuals who remain in detention or in deportation proceedings who may be eligible for DAPA or Expanded DACA. Therefore, we are launching the first-ever volunteer-led END Hotline to collect information about these particular cases. As well as to be able to provide some information about what may people do in case they have a loved one in detention or in proceedings that may qualify for this relief.

EXPLAIN THAT YOUR FAMILY MEMBER QUALIFIES FOR DAPA OR DACA AND IS NOT AN ENFORCEMENT PRIORITY, AND THAT ICE SHOULD RELEASE THEM. IN YOUR REQUEST INCLUDE YOUR RELATIVE'S FULL NAME, ALIEN REGISTRATION NUMBER (A-NUMBER), AND THE STATUS OF THEIR CASE.
