

Permanent resident visa.

This type of visa is for you if:

You are retired and moving to Mexico. You do not have work authorization.

General requirements:

- Application form ([English](#) or [Español](#))
- Valid passport in original and photocopy.
- Valid US VISA/ESTA and one photocopy.
- I-20; Original I-94, J-1 or I-797A and a one copy. (Or any other form that proves your legal status in the United States of America).
 - One photo: passport size, white background, in color and without glasses.
 - Consular fee \$53.00 USD in cash.

In addition, you need to present the following documents, depending on your situation:

Retired	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Last 12 months of bank statements or personal investments with an average balance of 280,000 USD. OR<input type="checkbox"/> Last 6 months of paystubs or social security pension with a minimum amount of 7,100 USD.
Family unification	<p><i>Marriage with a Mexican citizen:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Marriage or common-law certificate, and one photocopy.<input type="checkbox"/> Mexican passport or birth certificate of both parties, in original and one photocopy. Both parties need to be present during the interview. <p><i>Marriage with a temporary resident visa/card holder:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Marriage or common-law certificate, and one photocopy.<input type="checkbox"/> ID of visa or resident card holder.
