

Visitor Visa Without Permission to Engage in Remunerated Activities (Long Term)

Applicable to foreigners with substantial economic solvency, frequent travelers, prominent persons, spouse, common-law partner or equivalent of a Mexican national or a temporary or permanent resident, family member of a temporary or permanent resident, or of a diplomatic or consular officer accredited in Mexico, as well as supervisors of a foreign company with a subsidiary in national territory or executive staff of subsidiaries or commercial offices of Mexican companies abroad, who wish to enter Mexico under the immigration status of visitor without permission to engage in remunerated activities and who do not intend to reside in national territory.

Requirements:

- I. Valid Passport or id travel document under international law, in original;
- II. Original document proving legal stay, if the foreigner is not a citizen of the country where the visa is being requested; and
- III. Submit documents proving any of the following:
 - a) Economic solvency
 1. Original or digitally certified document proving investments or bank accounts with an average monthly balance equivalent to \$4,050 USD for the last six months; or
 2. Original documents showing employment or pension with monthly, tax-free income greater than \$1,310 USD for the last three months.
 - b) Frequent traveler
 1. Evidence of the relevant passport pages showing at least three valid visas or immigration control stamps, provided from countries not bordering the country of residence.
 - c) Prominent person
 - d) Family member of a Mexican national
 1. Spouse: must present a certified copy of the marriage certificate.
 2. Son/Daughter: must present a certified copy of the birth certificate.
 3. Brother/Sister: only if underage or of legal age who has not married, or is under legal guardianship due to interdiction, must present certified copies of the birth certificates of both parties.
 - e) Family member of a foreigner who is a temporary or permanent resident.
 - f) Family member of a diplomatic or consular officer accredited in Mexico holding an ordinary passport.
 - g) Supervisor of a foreign company with a subsidiary in national territory or executive staff of commercial offices or Mexican companies abroad.

Fee:

For the reception, processing, and, if applicable, authorization of the visa: \$53.00 USD

Appointment Request:

Once you have gathered the necessary requirements to apply for your visa, you must schedule an appointment by sending an email with your full name as it appears in your passport to: conomaha@sre.gob.mx

Appointments are personal and non-transferable.

There are no family appointments. Each adult must make their request individually. Minors under 18 years old may have their appointment scheduled by their parents or legal guardians.

Important Information: Holding a visa does not guarantee entry into national territory. It only allows the foreign national to present themselves at a port of entry to request entry into the country. Entry into Mexico is subject to approval by health and immigration authorities at ports of entry, known as immigration checkpoints, who may at any time conduct an interview regarding the purpose of the trip and verify the requirements established in the applicable legal provisions (Article 37 of the Immigration Law and Article 60 of its Regulations).
