

Permanent Resident Visa

Applicable to foreigners who wish to enter Mexico under the immigration status of Permanent Resident.

Requirements:

- I. Valid Passport or id travel document under international law, in original,
- II. Original document proving legal stay, if the foreigner is not a citizen of the country where the visa is being requested, and
- III. Submit documents proving any of the following:
 - a) Retirees or pensioners
 1. Original or digitally certified document proving investments or bank accounts with an average monthly balance equivalent to at least \$272,974 USD for the last twelve months; or
 2. Original documents showing pension income with monthly, tax-free amounts greater than the equivalent of \$6,789 USD for the last six months.
 - b) Family unity
 - In the case of parents, children, or children of the spouse of a Mexican national who are minors or adolescents and have not married, as well as brothers and sisters, the Mexican citizen must appear in person at the consular office along with the applicant and present:
 - Certified copy of their birth certificate,
 - Valid Mexican official ID (passport, consular ID card, voter ID, military service card, etc.),
 - Marriage certificate in the case of spouse's children.
 - Individuals holding Permanent Resident status must appear with the applicants and present their valid Permanent Resident card, in addition to the relevant birth and marriage certificates, as applicable.
 - c) Points system

NOTE: The residence card that certifies legal stay and allows the holder to remain in national territory must be obtained from the National Immigration Institute (INM) within 30 calendar days from the date of entry into Mexico.

Fee:

For the reception, processing, and, if applicable, authorization of the visa: \$54.00 USD

Appointment Request:

Once you have gathered the necessary requirements to apply for your visa, you must schedule an appointment by emailing with your full name as it appears in your passport to: conomaha@sre.gob.mx

Appointments are personal and non-transferable.

There are no family appointments. **Each adult must make their request individually.** Minors under 18 years old may obtain their appointment scheduled by their parents or legal guardians.

Important Information: Holding a visa does not guarantee entry into national territory. It only allows the foreign national to present themselves at a port of entry to request entry into the country. Entry into Mexico is subject to approval by health and immigration authorities at ports of entry, known as immigration checkpoints, who may at any time conduct an interview regarding the purpose of the trip and verify the requirements established in the applicable legal provisions (Article 37 of the Immigration Law and Article 60 of its Regulations).
