

Temporary Resident Visa

Applicable to foreigners who wish to enter Mexico under the immigration status of Temporary Resident with the purpose of staying for a period longer than 180 days and no longer than 4 years.

This type of visa allows the foreigner to work in Mexico, provided that the salary received is paid abroad.

If the applicant has a job offer in Mexico and will receive their salary within national territory, the company or individual employer must first obtain authorization directly from the National Immigration Institute for the issuance of the foreign national's visa.

Requirements:

- I. Valid Passport or id travel document under international law, in original,
- II. Original document proving legal stay, if the foreigner is not a citizen of the country where the visa is being requested, and
- III. Submit documents proving any of the following:
 - a) Economic solvency
 1. Original or digitally certified document proving investments or bank accounts with an average monthly balance equivalent to \$68,232 USD for the last twelve months; or
 2. Original documents showing employment or pension with monthly, tax-free income greater than \$1,310 USD for the last six months.
 - b) Scientific research in Mexican jurisdictional waters.
 - c) Invitation from a public or private organization or institution.
 - d) Under an international legal instrument for the mobility of persons.
 - e) Family unity
 - In the case of a spouse or children of a person holding a Temporary or Permanent Resident visa, proof of sufficient means to support each dependent must be presented through:
 - Original or digitally certified document proving investments or bank accounts with an average monthly balance equivalent to \$1,310 USD for the last twelve months, or
 - Original documents showing employment or pension with monthly, tax-free income greater than the equivalent of at least \$1,310 USD for the last six months.
 - In the case of a spouse of a Mexican citizen, the Mexican citizen must appear in person at the consular office along with the applicant and present:
 - Certified copy of their birth certificate;
 - Valid Mexican official identification (passport, consular ID card, voter ID, military service card, etc.).

- f) Real estate in Mexico
 - Original public deed (Escritura) executed before a Notary Public proving that the foreigner owns real estate valued at more than \$545,950 USD.

g) Investor

NOTE: In any case, the foreign national must apply within 30 calendar days from the date of entry into national territory for the residence card that certifies their legal stay and allows them to remain in Mexico.

Fee:

For the reception, processing, and, if applicable, authorization of the visa: \$54.00 USD

Appointment Request:

Once you have gathered the necessary requirements to apply for your visa, you must schedule an appointment by emailing with your full name as it appears in your passport to: conomaha@sre.gob.mx

Appointments are personal and non-transferable.

There are no family appointments. **Each adult must make their request individually.** Minors under 18 years old may obtain their appointment scheduled by their parents or legal guardians.

Important Information: Holding a visa does not guarantee entry into national territory. It only allows the foreign national to present themselves at a port of entry to request entry into the country. Entry into Mexico is subject to approval by health and immigration authorities at ports of entry, known as immigration checkpoints, who may at any time conduct an interview regarding the purpose of the trip and verify the requirements established in the applicable legal provisions (Article 37 of the Immigration Law and Article 60 of its Regulations).
