## I. Minors/ Dependents

If a visa application is presented by only one parent/guardian, said parent must provide a notarized authorization letter, which demonstrates that the non-accompanying parent consents to the visa application process on behalf of his/her child/children.

Minors applying on their own, or accompanied by a third party over the age of 18, must provide a letter of consent, signed by both parents and/or person(s) who exercise custody/ guardianship. It is mandatory to have the letter of consent notarized by a Notary Public or entity legally authorized to provide services in the jurisdiction
