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Persons born abroad, whose father and/or mother were born in Mexico, and thus attest/s to have Mexican nationality, are entitled to be registered as Mexicans. Once they have obtained the Mexican birth certificate, they will enjoy the rights granted by Mexican nationality. It is important to mention that by obtaining the Mexican nationality, US citizenship is neither affected nor lost.

PROCESS:

Registration takes place in three stages. **First stage**: Review of documents. **For the moment, and due to the sanitary contingency**, the first stage is being held **electronically**; therefore you must send scanned all the original documents –in PDF format, or readable photographs, and attached to your message, not in the same text- to the e-mail registrocivilsdi@sre.gob.mx, for their review. Once all the documents are approved, this Consulate will provide an appointment for the birth **registration**. **Second stage**: BIRTH REGISTRATION. At this stage you must bring originals and 2 copies of the approved documents. The following persons must attend: the applicant (minor or adult), both parents, if applicable, and two witnesses who, because of the health contingency, will be provided by the Consulate. **Third stage**: PICK UP – The birth certificates will be ready to pick up, if possible, the same day of the registration. In this last stage you will pay and pick up the birth certificates.

REQUIREMENTS:

- **1. Application form** must be completed in full according to the filling instructins. To download and print it, go to: http://consulmex.sre.gob.mx/sandiego/index.php/registro-civil/actas-de-nacimiento
- **2. US birth certificate of the applicant.** (Original and 2 letter-size copies). If the birth certificate is issued outside the United States, it must be apostilled or legalized by the issuing country, and translated into Spanish if different than English. (**NO** "abstracts" or short versions are accepted).
- 3. Valid official identification of the applicant with a recent photograph (original and 2 letter-size copies). It must contain full name as it appears on the foreign birth certificate. If under 18: valid US passport; or California ID; or valid school ID with photo; or proof of official studies properly signed with sealed photograph (stamp crossing the photo without covering the face), with the name as it appears on the birth certificate. Children under 6 years old: Valid US passport, or California ID, or a Letter (must be letterhead) issued and signed by his/her Pediatrician with full child's name, date of birth, full name of parents, and time of being his/her doctor, which must contain a recent photograph of the minor (with light colored clothes), with the physician's signature or seal/stamp crossing the photograph (without covering the face).
- **4. Birth Certificate of both parents,** (Original and two letter-sized copies). Both parents must prove their nationality (Mexican or foreign), however, in order to carry out the registration, it is necessary that at least one of them was born in Mexico and, therefore, proves his/her Mexican nationality.
- 5. Valid official identification with photo and signature of both parents, (original and 2 letter-size copies). Mexicans may submit Mexican passport or Matricula Consular, or Voting Card issued by the National Electoral Institute INE (formerly the Federal Electoral Institute IFE). If one parent is a foreigner, he/she must present his/her foreign passport (book type) or driver's license or ID issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). Important: Naturalized Mexican Americans (citizens) must present the respective Certificate of Naturalization; and in the case of permanent residents, submit the appropriate card (original and 2 letter-size copies). The identification must also contain the full name as it appears on the birth certificate.
- **6. Marriage certificate of parents** (if applicable). (Original and 2 letter-size copies). Abstract versions are not accepted. It is very important that the wedding took place <u>6 months before</u> the birth of the applicant. In the event that it was held after, or the parents were not married, the father must appear on the day of the registration to sign the records. If the father is not able to appear at the Consulate, he must submit a <u>Poder Especial</u> (Special Power of Attorney) issued by a Notary Public in Mexico, or a Consulate of Mexico, in which the father recognizes paternity and grants permission the applicant to be registered as a Mexican at the Consulate. If the father died or is not available- or the parents were never married before the birth of the person to be registered, birth registration does NOT proceed at the Consulate. In this case, you may apply for registration at any *Oficina de Registro Civil* in Mexico; such offices should be contacted for requirements. This process is called "Insertion of Foreign Birth Certificate"
- 7. Valid official identification with photograph and signature of **two witnesses** (regardless of nationality), over 18 years old, (2 letter-size copies). For the moment, and due to the sanitary contingence, the Consulate will be providing the witnesses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- In case of death of either parent, the birth certificate and the respective death certificate must be presented. <u>If any of the parents are foreigners, please present ONLY Death Certificate.</u>
- The procedure is free of charge and includes the first certified copy of the Mexican birth certificate. Subsequet certified copies cost US\$ 14.00 each. (Debit/credit cards and cash. AmEx not accepted).
- All applications are subject to the review of documents for approval. In some cases, additional documents may be requested.
- In case of errors or omissions in the documents submitted, the applicant must first request the correction/s with the relevant authorities.



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• All photocopies submitted must be legible. In the case of identifications, photo and signature must be clearly visible. Do not forget to photocopy both sides of the identifications and documentation where applicable.
