

BIRTH REGISTRY

People born abroad whose father and / or mother attesting / n their Mexican nationality, are entitled to be registered as Mexicans. After obtaining his birth certificate, they can enjoy the rights granted Mexican citizenship. It is important to mention that to get their Mexican nationality does not lose nor does it affect US citizenship.

PROCESS:

Registration is carried out in three stages.

First stage: Without an appointment please present all the documents mentioned below.

Second stage: In the assigned appointment must bring the original and two copies of the documents, in order to carry out the registration. At this stage books must be filed, the person to be registered (minor or adult), both parents, if applicable, and the two witnesses.

Third stage: Anyone can pick up the certified copies. Usually they delivered within two or three days of registration made.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Application must be completed in full.
2. Certificate of American Registered Birth (Birth Certificate), original and 2 copies of letter size (A4). If the certificate is issued outside the United States, it shall be apostilled or legalized by the country (NOT the "abstracts" short versions are accepted).
3. Current official identification of the registered original and 2 copies of letter size (A4) that must contain full name as it appears on your birth certificate. If under 18 years can submit: American passport in force or California ID with the name as it appears on the birth certificate. Children under 6 years can submit valid US passport or California ID force.
4. Birth Certificate of both parents, original and 2 copies of letter size (A4). Both parents must prove their nationality (Mexican and / or foreign); however to carry out the processing is necessary that at least one of them proves their Mexican nationality.
5. Valid official identification with photo and signature of both parents, original and 2 copies of letter size (A4). Mexicans may submit Mexican passport or Consular ID, or Voting Card issued by the National Electoral Institute (formerly the Federal Electoral

Institute). If one parent is abroad, it is necessary to present their foreign passport (book type) or driver's license or ID issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles corresponding (DMV). Important: The naturalized Mexican Americans (citizens) must present the relevant certificate; and in the case of permanent residents, submit the appropriate card, and 2 copies of letter size. The identification shall also contain the full name as it appears on your birth certificate.

6. Marriage certificate of parents (if applicable), original and 2 copies of letter size (A4). It is very important that the marriage has been made before the birth of the registrant. In the event it has been held later, Father Duty to appear on the record. If the parent cannot attend the meeting, you must submit a power of attorney issued by a Notary Public in Mexico or Consulate of Mexico in which the father acknowledges paternity and granting permission to be registered as a Mexican to this Consulate General. If the father died and not married before the birth of the person to register, birth registration does not come at the Consulate. In this case, you can apply for registration of foreign birth certificate at any Registry Office in Mexico, for which you should contact these offices to apply the requirements. This act is called "Inserting Foreign Act".

7. Valid official identification with photo and signature of two witnesses (regardless of nationality), over 18 years old, 2 copies of letter size (A4). Witnesses must be different people and parents must bring the original identifications the day of registration.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- In case of death of either parent, you must present a birth certificate of the father who died and their respective death certificate.
- The procedure is free and includes the first certified copy of Mexican birth certificate. Certified copies later have a cost of \$ 13.00 dollars.
- All applications are subject to review of documents for approval. In some cases it may request additional documentation.
- In case of errors or omissions in the documents submitted, the applicant must request correction to the authorities first. All photocopies submitted must be read clearly. In the case of identification, photo and signature must be clearly visible. Do not forget to photocopy both sides of the identification and documentation where appropriate.
