The "Strategy of the Financial Help Desks" is developed jointly between the Institute of Mexicans Abroad and the Mexican consular representatives, which can count financial and educational institutions, civil society organizations, and/or local authorities in the United States of America and Canada as allies or partners.

The alliances should be made with public institutions or non-profit organizations with experience and proven results in offering free tax preparation, education, and financial inclusion services.

The agreement which will benefit thousands of people and gives a precedent for an alliance of this kind was signed in presence of our witness of honor Mr. Luis Gutiérrez, the head of the Institute for Mexicans Abroad. The Consul General of Mexico in Vancouver, Berenice Díaz Ceballos, and Olga Stachova, CEO of MOSAIC BC signed the agreement.
